



"Friendship"


Proverbs 27:1-10

1 Do not boast about tomorrow, For you do not know what a day may bring forth. 2 Let another man praise you, and not your own mouth; A stranger, and not your own lips. 3 A stone *is* heavy and sand *is* weighty, But a fool's wrath *is* heavier than both of them. 4 Wrath *is* cruel and anger a torrent, But who *is* able to stand before jealousy? 5 Open rebuke *is* better Than love carefully concealed. 6 Faithful *are* the wounds of a friend, But the kisses of an enemy *are* deceitful. 7 A satisfied soul loathes the honeycomb, But to a hungry soul every bitter thing *is* sweet. 8 Like a bird that wanders from its nest *Is* a man who wanders from his place. 9 Ointment and perfume delight the heart, And the sweetness of a man's friend *gives delight* by hearty counsel. 10 Do not forsake your own friend or your father's friend, Nor go to your brother's house in the day of your calamity; Better *is* a neighbor nearby than a brother far away.
