### CONFESSION OF SIN

*Numbers 11:10–20*

"Then Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, everyone at the door of his tent; and the anger of the LORD was greatly aroused; Moses also was displeased. So Moses said to the LORD, "Why have You afflicted Your servant? And why have I not found favor in Your sight, that You have laid the burden of all these people on me? Did I conceive all these people? Did I beget them, that You should say to me, "Carry them in your bosom, as a guardian carries a nursing child,' to the land which You swore to their fathers? Where am I to get meat to give to all these people? For they weep all over me, saying, "Give us meat, that we may eat.' I am not able to bear all these people alone, because the burden *is* too heavy for me. If You treat me like this, please kill me here and now—if I have found favor in Your sight—and do not let me see my wretchedness!" So the LORD said to Moses: "Gather to Me seventy men of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tabernacle of meeting, that they may stand there with you. Then I will come down and talk with you there. I will take of the Spirit that *is* upon you and will put *the same* upon them; and they shall bear the burden of the people with you, that you may not bear *it* yourself alone. Then you shall say to the people, "Consecrate yourselves for tomorrow, and you shall eat meat;

for you have wept in the hearing of the LORD, saying, 'Who will give us meat to eat? For *it was* well with us in Egypt.'" Therefore the LORD will give you meat, and you shall eat. You shall eat, not one day, nor two days, nor five days, nor ten days, nor twenty days, but *for* a whole month, until it comes out of your nostrils and becomes loathsome to you, because you have despised the LORD who is among you, and have wept before Him, saying, "Why did we ever come up out of Egypt?"

## SERMON NOTES

"The Display of Christ's Compassion"

*Mark 8:1-12*

**1** In those days, the multitude being very great and having nothing to eat, Jesus called His disciples *to Him* and said to them, **2** "I have compassion on the multitude, because they have now continued with Me three days and have nothing to eat. **3** And if I send them away hungry to their own houses, they will faint on the way; for some of them have come from afar." **4** Then His disciples answered Him, "How can one satisfy these people with bread here in the wilderness?" **5** He asked them, "How many loaves do you have?" And they said, "Seven." **6** So He commanded the multitude to sit down on the ground. And He took the seven loaves and gave thanks, broke *them* and gave *them* to His disciples to set before *them*; and they set *them* before the multitude. **7** They also had a few small fish; and having blessed them, He said to set them also before *them*. **8** So they ate and were filled, and they took up seven large baskets of leftover fragments. **9** Now those who had eaten were about four thousand. And He sent them away, **10** immediately got into the boat with His disciples, and came to the region of Dalmanutha. **11** Then the Pharisees came out and began to dispute with Him, seeking from Him a sign from heaven, testing Him. **12** But He sighed deeply in His spirit, and said, "Why does this generation seek a sign? Assuredly, I say to you, no sign shall be given to this generation."
